

## Player and Parent Code Of Conduct

Players, parents, spectators, coaches and umpires are to observe their respective Aussie Sports Code of Conduct as outlined below. Failure to observe the Code of Conduct may result in the offending person(s) being brought before the Executive Committee for an explanation and possible disciplinary action.

### Player's Code of Conduct

- Play for the fun of it.
- Compete by the rules and always abide by the umpire's decision.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain or coach approach the official during a break or after the game.
- Control my temper. Make no criticism either by word or gesture.
- Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent and throwing equipment is not acceptable or permitted in any sport.
- Work equally hard for myself and my team. My team's performance will benefit, so will my own.
- Be a good sport. Encourage fellow team members.
- Be willing to train and prepare for the game. Preparation helps prevent injury and increases the level of enjoyment.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- At all times co-operate with my coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.
- Remember the goals of the game are to have fun, improve my skills, be modest in success and generous in defeat.
- Wear full and correct NR RSL Netball uniform, including dress, shorts and white socks.
- Under no circumstances is jewelry to be worn on the court. All earrings, studs, rings, watches, Fitbits are to be removed prior to the game. All fingernails must be trimmed prior to the umpire's inspection. Hair must be tied back or up.

### Parent's Code of Conduct

- Encourage your child/ren to always play according to the rules.
- Respect team members, opponents, managers, coaches and officials at all times.
- Never ridicule, yell or use inappropriate language, or physically abuse any player, manager, coach or umpire.
- Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good plays by both teams.
- If you disagree with an official, raise your issue through your team's manager or coach who will voice your concerns with the appropriate ERNA Official and/or NR RSL Netball Club Committee. Remember, most officials voluntarily give their time and effort for your child's enjoyment.
- Support your coach and manager by ensuring your child attends training sessions.
- Support your child's team by volunteering your time when required at Club Meetings and in the Canteen, Table Duty, Scoring Roster, etc.
- The coach will allocate appropriate game time to those players who are unable to attend training.

IF AND WHEN a breach of this Agreement occurs **or** if there is a recurrent breach of this Agreement after a written warning has been given, further action may be taken by the Club Committee.
